James 4:6-10 But He gives more grace. Therefore He says: "God resists the proud, But gives grace to the humble." 7 Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. 8 Draw near to God, and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you double-minded. 9 Lament and mourn and weep! Let your laughter be turned to mourning and your joy to gloom. 10 Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and He will lift you up.

The meaning of 5785

As we enter the Hebrew year 5785, let's continue to focus on the number 85.

The number 8 signifies this decade which represents biblically new beginnings. In Hebrew, 8, corresponds to the word "Pey," which means "mouth." Using our mouths to speak life and truth.

The current year, number 5, in 5785, denotes the year we are in. This number biblically represents grace. In Hebrew, the number 5 is associated with the letter "Hey" (ה), which symbolizes **Divine Breath, Revelation, and God's Grace.**

The Pey-Hey Principle

"The Pey Hey Principle" refers to speaking God's word with faith, by the influence of the Holy Spirit, so that God's promises can manifest in our lives.

Pey, we use our mouths to speak words of truth that lead to the Zoe Life, a life of abundance and increase.

Whenever one speaks life, they should expect growth because everything that God has ever given, "The Zoe Life," too, increases abundantly.

And hey, the holy spirit will influence us on what to speak so the promises will manifest.

The enemy that wants to silence you or to get you to say the wrong thing. He wants to be the one that creates your future. Don't let your mouth give him that power.

Luke 19:13 So he called ten of his servants, delivered to them ten minas, (as a gift) and said to them, 'Do business till I come.

God has placed us where we are for a reason. We are meant to prosper and serve the kingdom, regardless of our surroundings.

God will always provide for those in abundance who do His business.

The most important person in our lives is the Holy Spirit. The greatest capability that we get from the Holy Spirit is the ability to speak.

The key factor in doing business for the Lord is our willingness to embrace change through the Holy Spirit!



We are to be used by God as Agents of Change, being ambassadors for Christ to “**Do business (occupy) till He comes**”.

2 Corinthians 5:18... And God has given us this task (ministry) meaning the office of ministering in divine things on a divine level.” In other words, ministering from the supernatural or the 4th dimension.

One of the most profound and divine responsibilities we have as Christians is to share the glorious gospel of Jesus Christ by proclaiming the message of His love and salvation. We also use our unique gifts and talents to assist them in renewing their minds and transforming their thoughts to align with the teachings and mindset of Christ.

...of reconciling people to him. When we allow God to use us as ambassadors, agents of change, we call the unsaved back to God and help transform their lives after they are reconciled to God.

We have been called out, “Chosen,” to reconcile people to God, to Save the Lost, and to Transform the Saved. This is done by allowing the supernatural presence, power, and wisdom of God (the Holy Spirit) to change us. *Renewal and change will happen as we commit to allowing the Holy Spirit to renew our minds first.*

As we are being changed, we can be used to change the lives of others.

As we allow the Holy Spirit to do His work in us, He can use us as agents of change.

Just because the atmosphere will change on national and global levels, does not mean that we have to stagnate or decrease at all.

The Pey-Hey Principle allows us to “**do business (occupy) until He comes**”, as we do business more opportunities for us to prosper, grow, and effectively serve the kingdom on Another Level will occur.

Remember, “The Pey-Hey Principle” refers to speaking God's word by faith, by the influence of the Holy Spirit, so that God's promises can manifest in our lives.

You don't have to live perfectly for “The Pey-Hey Principle” to work.

Job 22:27-30 You will make your prayer to Him, He will hear you, And you will pay your vows. 28 You will also declare a thing, And it will be established for you; So light will shine on your ways. 29 When they cast you down, and you say, 'Exaltation will come!' Then He will save the humble person. The word exaltation in Hebrew is “Gewah”, which refers to God's action to help a downhearted person, a lifting up or an injection of confidence.

30 He will even deliver one who is not innocent; Yes, he will be delivered by the purity of your (God's) hands."

2 Corinthians 1:20-22 For all of God's promises have been fulfilled in Christ with a resounding "Yes!" And through Christ, our "Amen" (which means "Yes, let it be unto me according to your word") ascends to God for his glory

...22 and he has identified us as his own by placing the Holy Spirit in our hearts as the first installment that guarantees everything, he has promised us.

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It's because we have the Holy Spirit that all of God's promises are Guaranteed; the Father has already okayed the transaction; all we need to do is speak the Word by faith.

We should aim to embrace not only the promises God offers for material abundance and blessings, but also expect to receive those promises that reveal who we are, our capabilities, and what we can achieve.

In fact, understanding our identity and purpose in Him should take precedence over the material abundance and blessings we can receive.

When we focus on who we are called to be and the business we are called to do, the material blessing will have more meaning.

All of God's promises are yes and amen. God's promises are good anywhere, anyplace, and at any time.

“The Pey-Hey Principle” is key because the enlightenment of the Holy Spirit will encourage us to live more in God’s presence, to be open vessels for Him to breathe in us, allowing Him (the Holy Spirit) to guide the transformation of who we are, our words, and actions.

As we embrace “The Pey-Hey Principle” this year, we will become the agents of change, transforming ordinary moments into extraordinary divine encounters as His promises manifest.
