



Man was created as the Speaking Spirit. Pt 2

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The ability to create and govern through language is a unique human trait. Satan recognizes the power of spoken words and constantly seeks to influence people to speak words that contaminate, defile, and destroy.

That is why he used lies and deceit to manipulate Eve; he knew that she and Adam were created as speaking spirits whose words would bring about the results of what God said.

God created man in His own image, and as an imager (one who represents God in thought, speech, and behavior).

Since Jehovah God is triune, we can think like the Father, speak with the creative power of Jesus, and exhibit God's character through the Holy Spirit's enablement.

Man is a Speaking Spirit

The Power of Speech was not given to man for his own amusement but as a creative force.

Adam: Mankind, or human beings, became speaking spirits. Mankind was initially created as a spiritual being.

Genesis 1:27 So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them.

The Hebrew word “bara” means to create from nothing, indicating that male and female share the same spiritual substance as God.

God formed man's body from the dust of the earth and breathed into it, making him a living soul.

Genesis 2:7 And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living being.

The Hebrew word "yatsar" means "to form" or "to fashion," much like a potter shapes clay, highlighting a deliberate creation process. Its primitive root implies molding into a shape, contrasting with the broader term "bara," which means creating something from nothing.

The apostle Paul further defines that man is a triune being in **1 Thessalonians 5:23-24 Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely; and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.**

Every living being is created with the purpose and potential to communicate in the spirit with the Spirit of God and His creations.

We see this in mankind's first assignment, as described in **Genesis 2:19-20: "Out of the ground, the Lord God formed every beast of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to Adam to see what he**



would call them. And whatever Adam called each living creature, that was its name. So Adam gave names to all cattle, to the birds of the air, and to every beast of the field."

This passage highlights humanity's ability to name things as God ordained, showing that we can use the power of speech to express faith and align our thoughts with God's mind.

Although God created the animals, it was Adam whom God assigned to name them according to how He had formed them.

While our logical minds understand literal meanings, it is essential for our spirits to engage with the Spirit of God's Word. This connection imparts inspiration and revelation.

It is through this revelation of communication between our spirit and God's spirit that we know we are saved. **Romans 8:16 The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God,**

"**To bear witness**" is the Greek word "summarturō," meaning "joint testimony." It indicates a corroborating voice.

This spiritual communication between our spirit and God's Spirit assures us of our salvation, even if we don't fully grasp the process.

The first language of humanity was spiritual. Adam received direct communication from God, allowing him to grasp profound truths without a complex vocabulary. This concept is illustrated in **Genesis 2:19-20**, where Adam names the animals, reflecting his deep understanding of their nature and a connection to the Creator.

Jesus operated in this same Spiritual truth of getting extraordinary results without the need for extensive vocabulary when He fed the five thousand in **Matthew 15:33-39**. **Then His disciples said to Him, "Where could we get enough bread in the wilderness to fill such a great multitude?" 34 Jesus said to them, "How many loaves do you have?" And they said, "Seven, and a few little fish." 35 So He commanded the multitude to sit down on the ground. 36 And He took the seven loaves and the fish and *gave thanks*, broke them and gave them to His disciples; and the disciples gave to the multitude. 37 So they all ate and were filled, and they took up seven large baskets full of the fragments that were left. 38 Now those who ate were four thousand men, besides women and children.**

We see Jesus just speaking a few words to heal the woman who had been bent over for eighteen years. **Luke 13:10-13 Now He was teaching in one of the synagogues on the Sabbath. 11 And behold, there was a woman who had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bent over and could in no way raise herself up. 12 But when Jesus saw her, He called her to Him and said to her, "Woman, you are loosed from your infirmity." 13 And He laid His hands on her, and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God.**

Regardless of our individual native languages, these are secondary to God's spiritual language, which is the revelation of His Rhema Word. It is this Rhema Word of Truth that humanity is created to live by. In **Matthew 4:4**, Jesus says, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.'" **Deuteronomy 8:3** echoes this, stating, "So He humbled you, allowed you to hunger, and fed you with manna which you did not know nor did your fathers know, that He might make you



know that man shall not live by bread alone; but man lives by every word that proceeds from the mouth of the Lord."

The Complete Word Study Dictionary states that the term for "word" in this verse is Rhema in Greek, which means Command, referring to everything that God decrees.

When God breathed into Adam, He imparted His Spirit, making Adam a speaking spirit in God's image.

Romans 8:16 "The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit." Our spirit must hear and speak what God says for His plans to be manifested on earth and in our lives.

The Holy Spirit is the primary witness, and we are His earthly representatives, enabling heavenly realities to manifest on earth.

In God's book, you were saved before the foundation of the world (**Psalms 139**). The Spirit of God revealed Jesus as Lord and Savior, allowing you to agree in your spirit and speak it out, confirming your salvation. This agreement manifested in your earthly body, already established in heaven.

When we speak words that reflect God's promises, principles, and goodness, we see in life and in God, we have the power to shape our futures positively. However, if our words stray from these promises, principles, and goodness, they can become meaningless or even harmful.

Gossip is a major concern because it often stems from a tendency to criticize others negatively. When people gossip, they usually focus on hurtful comments rather than constructive ones. Sometimes, this behavior is influenced by outside forces, such as the enemy, which promotes negativity, as he recognizes just how powerful words can be.

Gossip can create unfair opinions about others, opinions that wouldn't exist if gossip hadn't spread. This can hurt not only the person being talked about but also those who hear the gossip, as it can change their understanding of reality about the person being talked about.

The Bible addresses this issue and cautions us against judging others. For example, **Matthew 7:1-2** says, **"Don't judge others, and you won't be judged. The way you treat others is how you will be treated."** This reminds us to be kind and to avoid spreading gossip about others, as it will have a negative influence on the lives of those who spread it as well.

Matthew 12:34-37 Brood of vipers! How can you, being evil, speak good things? For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks. 35 A good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good things, and an evil man out of the evil treasure brings forth evil things.

36 But I say to you that for every idle word men may speak, they will give account of it in the day of judgment. 37 For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned."

"Idle Words": The phrase "idle word" refers to words that are empty, careless, or lacking in merit, such as falsehoods.

When we speak words that align with the truth of God by faith, it has a creative power to manifest what we are saying. We have the power to choose blessing or cursing, life or death by simply speaking!
