The Power of Speech was not given to man for his own amusement but as a creative force.

God created man as a being to communicate with Him on His level.

God created man to operate as he would in this physical realm of existence.

We see this in mankind's first assignment, as described in Genesis 2:19-20: "Out of the ground, the Lord God formed every beast of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to Adam to see what he would call them. And whatever Adam called each living creature, that was its name. So Adam gave names to all cattle, to the birds of the air, and to every beast of the field."

Humanity has the creative ability to name things in the physical world as God intended. Humanity's disconnection from God when they sinned introduced a barrier to the divine purpose intended for human beings.

When we speak words that reflect God's promises, principles, and goodness, we have the power to shape our futures positively.

However, if our words stray from these promises, principles, and goodness, they can become meaningless or even harmful.

Gossip is a major concern because it often stems from a tendency to criticize others negatively. When people gossip, they usually focus on hurtful comments rather than constructive ones. Sometimes, this behavior is influenced by outside forces, such as the enemy, which promotes negativity, as he recognizes just how powerful words can be.

Gossip can create unfair opinions about others, opinions that wouldn't exist if gossip hadn't spread. This can hurt not only the person being talked about but also those who hear the gossip, as it can change their understanding of reality about the person being talked about.

The Bible addresses this issue and cautions us against judging others. For example, Matthew 7:1-2 says, "Don't judge others, and you won't be judged. The way you treat others is how you will be treated."

This reminds us to be kind and to avoid spreading gossip about others, as it can have a negative influence on the lives of those who spread it.

Matthew 12:34-37 Brood of vipers! How can you, being evil, speak good things? For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks. 35 A good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good things, and an evil man out of the evil treasure brings forth evil things.

36 But I say to you that for every idle word men may speak, they will give account of it in the day of judgment. 37 For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned."



"Idle Words": The phrase "idle word" refers to words that are empty, careless, or lacking in merit, such as falsehoods.

When we speak words that align with the truth of God by faith, they have the power to manifest what we say.

We have the power to choose blessing or cursing, life or death, by simply speaking!

According to Genesis 1:28, God bestowed a blessing upon humanity, instructing them to "be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

Because of sin, humanity shifted from using their speech as a divine tool to fulfill God's will to mainly using it as a way to support a world full of sin and imperfection.

God expected humanity would fulfill these responsibilities by utilizing their most significant capability: the ability to articulate and manifest God's will through faith. God's intentions for life on Earth.

The arrival of Jesus was significant, as it aimed to restore the connection between mankind and God, enabling people to harness their speech in the creative manner that was intended from the beginning.

Jesus emphasizes the power of belief in conjunction with speech: Mark 11:23-24, "For assuredly, I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, 'Be removed and be cast into the sea,' and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that those things he says will be done, he will have whatever he says. 24 Therefore I say to you, whatever things you ask when you pray, believe that you receive them, and you will have them."

Jesus highlights the importance of faith and intention when speaking, praying, and confessing, suggesting that our words can manifest His divine will and purpose.

It is the Word of Truth that humanity is meant to speak and live by.

Matthew 4:4, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.'"

Deuteronomy 8:3 "So He humbled you, allowed you to hunger, and fed you with manna which you did not know nor did your fathers know, that He might make you know that man shall not live by bread alone; but man lives by every word that proceeds from the mouth of the Lord."

The Complete Word Study Dictionary states that the Greek term for "word" in this verse is Rhema, meaning Command, referring to everything God reveals and decrees.

When God breathed into Adam, He imparted His Spirit, making Adam a speaking spirit created in the image and likeness of God, who is a speaking Spirit.

Romans 8:16 states, "The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit."

"The phrase 'bears witness' comes from a Greek word combination: 'summartureo,' which suggests intimacy and means 'together,' and 'martureo,' which means 'to witness." Collectively, it literally means to bear witness alongside someone or in support of another person.



The Bible teaches that the Holy Spirit is always in communication with our spirit regarding all aspects of life.

John 14:26, "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things and remind you of everything I have said to you."

For this to occur, our spirit must be able to hear what God is saying so we can speak it from our spirits through our mouth, and it be manifested here on the earth!
